

RECIPE

Homemade Clay (For Crafting & Play – Not for Eating!)

INGREDIENTS

2 ½ C Flour

1 Tbsp Salad Oil

2 Tbsp Powdered Alum

½ C Salt

Food Coloring

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Mix ingredients together minus the water.
- 2. Pour 2 C boiling water over the mixture, put on a warm burner and work till it feels like clay.
- 3. Knead until smooth. Store in tight container.

RECIPE

Sausage Seasoning By Rhoda Miller

1 C Brown Sugar

10 Tbsp Salt

6 Tbsp Liquid Smoke

INGREDIENTS

25 # Ground Pork

2 Tbsp Black Pepper

2 Tbsp Red Pepper

Triangle Communications and Hill County Electric Host 3rd Annual Trades Day

Triangle Communications and Hill County Electric recently held the 3rd Annual Trades Day, providing high school students with hands-on exposure to various skilled trades. The cooperatives partnered with MSU-Northern, CHR Solutions, Vermeer, and VEC to offer nine different learning tracks in the morning.

During lunch, students attended presentations highlighting career opportunities in the trades, including job availability, wages, training programs, and educational pathways. In the afternoon, they selected a trade track of interest and participated in hands-on activities.

Students had the opportunity to engage in a variety of activities, including:

- Building and testing network cables
- Using SQL queries as a Digital Crime Scene Investigator to uncover clues
- Operating a bore machine through a virtual simulator provided by Vermeer and an actual bore machine
- Conducting a Geo Caching exercise using GPS coordinates
- Splicing fiber
- Wiring a meter loop
- Constructing a marshmallow shooter with plumbing materials
- Accessing the computers on a Vermeer plow and a digger truck for repair diagnostics
- Hands on welding exercises

Craig Gates, CEO of Hill County Electric and Triangle Communications, emphasized the value of the event:

"Trades Day is a great way to show students the career paths available outside of a traditional four-year college degree. The trades offer excellent career opportunities, allowing individuals to gain hands-on experience while earning a paycheck."

Nearly 170 students from 10 area high schools attended the event. MSU-Northern also brought students from its Plumbing, Welding, Diesel Technology, and Global Positioning courses, allowing high school participants to interact with college students already pursuing careers in the trades.

Trades Day continues to be an invaluable experience for students, offering realworld exposure to in-demand careers and the skills needed to succeed in them.

- District 6 The At-Large District (members can reside in any Triangle exchange).


To run for an open position in **Districts 1 or 2**, you must reside within the district. However, **District 6** is open to members from any Triangle exchange.

Government Assistance Program. Lower your monthly bill!

If your household is eligible, you can receive:

Up to a \$9.25/ month discount on your internet service

Up to a \$34.25/ month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands

If you or someone in your household participates in one of the following programs, apply today!

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as Food Stamps
- Medicaid
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
- Income is 135% or less than the Federal Poverty Guidelines

Additional options for Tribal Lands

- Any of the federal assistance programs listed above
- Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance

MONTANA TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACCESS PROGRAM

If you or someone you love has difficulty using a standard telephone, connect with the Montana Accessible Communications (MTAC) and Montana Relay, a service of the Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services.

About Montana Relay

Montana Relay is a public service that guarantees all citizens have access to prompt, professional, and accurate communication via telephone. Consumers of these specialized services - specifically individuals who are deaf, DeafBlind, hard of hearing, or have difficulty speaking - can communicate through Traditional Relay Service (TTY), Voice Carry Over (VCO), Hearing Carry Over (HCO), Speech-to-Speech (STS), Spanish Relay, and Captioned Telephone. This helps ensure they can connect with family, friends, and businesses with ease.

How Montana Relay works

Dial 711 to connect with Montana Relay. A qualified Communication Assistant (CA) will ask for the area code and number of the person you wish to call and begin relaying the conversation. Typically, the CA voices the typed message from the TTY user to the person on the other end, then types the spoken response back to the TTY user.

Specialized Services

Montana Relay offers specialized services for individuals who have difficulty speaking, including Spanish-speaking residents. Specially trained CAs are available to assist with these types of calls by dialing the numbers provided on this page. Since Montana Relay offers a variety of services, please refer to the website or contact Montana Relay for detailed instructions on how a particular call is processed.

Captioned Telephone

Captioned Telephone is ideal for individuals who have hearing loss but are still able to speak. A captioned telephone works like any other phone, with one key difference: it allows users to listen to conversations while reading captions of what is being said to them.

Access to Services

Dialing 711 provides toll-free access to relay services. If you experience trouble dialing 711, please contact Montana Relay.

Emergency Calls

Please note: 711 can only be used to reach Montana Relay. In an emergency, always dial 911.

If you use a TTY, call 911 or your local emergency service TTY number directly. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires all 911 centers to have a TTY and be prepared to handle emergency calls in this format.

Montana Relay will make every effort to assist in an emergency; however, relay centers are not 911 centers and do not assume responsibility for emergency calls.
