


RECIPE

4B's Old-Fashioned Cream of Tomato Soup (Pictured)

INGREDIENTS

- 1 can (28 oz.) diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 c. chicken broth
- ¼ c. butter or margarine
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 1 Tbsp. chopped onion
- 1/8 tsp. baking soda
- 2 c. heavy cream

DIRECTIONS

In a saucepan, combine the first six ingredients. Cover and simmer for 1 hour. Heat cream in the top of a double boiler over simmering water; add to the tomato mixture just before serving.

CEO MESSAGE

On behalf of the Triangle Communications Board, management team and employees, I would like to wish all our members a very Happy New Year!

In today's world, a reliable internet connection is essential, which is why Triangle continues to plow fiber across our service territory. Triangle has completed fiber upgrades in 32 of our 39 exchanges, 2 exchanges are waiting for fiber and 5 exchanges are partially upgraded.

The winter weather has slowed down our Fiber to the Home construction. The construction projects in Whispering Pines and in the town of Big Timber have aerial work that has slowed. Even if the weather cooperates the contractors will continue to work when they can. Triangle continues to plan for our 2023 and 2024 fiber buildouts. South Chester, Geraldine and the Hays and Lodgepole areas if we are given right of way from the Fort Belknap Community Council. If we are unable to obtain the right of way, Triangle will move on to a portion of Big Timber in 2023 and hope that the Fort Belknap Community Council gives consent in 2023 for a 2024 build.

Triangle offers the FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) benefit which provides up to \$30 per month discount for internet service and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM (ACP)

We're excited to participate in the FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). This program is designed to make broadband more affordable and accessible for all. Through this program, qualifying members will be eligible for a discount on internet service.

The ACP program helps low-income households pay for broadband service.

- Up to a \$30/month discount on your internet service
- Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands

Program Requirements

To qualify for this discount program, your household must fulfill one of the below requirements:

- Has an income that is at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines. Participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline
- Participates in Tribal specific programs, such as Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
- Is approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year

Only one monthly service discount is allowed per household.

Please have your Qualifying ID Number ready to provide. An additional form will be emailed to you by the customer service representative to be completed before the ACP credit can be added.

Household may make changes to their existing service at any time.*

SMARTHUB FEATURES – MULTIPLE USER ACCOUNTS AND CONTACTS

Triangle business customers, your requests have been answered! Now, business customers have the ability to set up multiple SmartHub/Triangle Communications accounts as well as add more contact points for non-billing related account issues!

You can now create individual accounts for multiple users within your organization. Use the **“Manage my Registered Accounts”** option under **My Profile > My Information** in SmartHub online to add and manage additional account users to your Triangle Communications online account.

The **“Show Frequently Asked Questions”** link will address what these additional users can access and other questions you might have. To create additional SmartHub access accounts for users in your organization, click the **“Add Users”** button.

Not all employees within an organization need to have access to all features and notifications. Business customers can now customize notification settings for different events and for multiple email addresses and text message alerts. To add email addresses and/or text numbers for individuals who need to receive notifications, simply go to **Notifications > Manage Contacts** within SmartHub. Once the contact points have been added, you can enroll each contact point for various types of notification events by going to the Manage Notifications setting. **Please be sure your IT and network contacts are subscribed to “Maintenance Notice” under the “On Demand” category.** Click **“Save Settings”** once all changes have been made.

BACKUP POWER CUSTOMER ANNUAL NOTICE

Traditional Residential Voice: For many years, your home telephone would allow you to stay connected to emergency voice services during a power outage. However, if your residential voice telephone service is provided using fiber optics or fixed wireless rather than the traditional copper-based line, then your traditional residential voice telephone service requires backup battery power to continue functioning during an outage. To avoid a disruption of home voice service during an outage - and to maintain the ability to connect to 911 emergency services - Triangle Communications provides you with a battery for backup power for your traditional residential voice telephone service at the time of the initial installation at no additional cost.

Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP Service): Voice service that is delivered over Triangle Communications network to their home via an Internet connection is a VoIP service. VoIP service subscribers have the option to purchase an Uninterruptable Power Supply (UPS)/ battery backup from Triangle Communications or provide their own. In case of a power outage the UPS/ battery backup obtained through Triangle will provide power for approximately 2 hours talk time with 8 hours standby time for VoIP service. However, without this battery backup this service (including dialing 911) will not function during a power outage. Subscribers may purchase a longer lasting UPS if desired. Residential subscribers will own the battery backup and are responsible for maintenance and replacement of the unit.

What Your Battery Can - and Can't - Do for You: The backup battery provided by Triangle Communications for powering the fiber optic or fixed wireless network terminal on traditional residential voice services allows you to continue to use your home voice services during a power outage. Without a backup battery or alternate backup source such as a generator, customers with fiber or fixed wireless based traditional residential telephone service will not be able to make any calls, including emergency calls to 911. The only way to maintain the ability to use your telephone is by using some form of backup power.

Our backup battery does not provide power to any services other than voice. All Internet services are turned off in the network terminal after 5 minutes of power outage to better conserve battery power for voice service on traditional voice services. Home security systems, cordless phones, medical monitoring devices and other equipment will not run on a residential voice telephone backup battery.

Replacement Options: As previously noted, a backup battery has been provided by Triangle Communications during the initial installation for traditional residential voice services. However, the battery provided by our company may need to be replaced every two or three years or when the battery is no longer functioning.

- **Triangle Communications provided replacement backup batteries:** Triangle Communications will provide and install at no cost to you, a replacement backup battery, upon

appointment, when it becomes known that the battery needs to be replaced on traditional voice services. If you have any questions, please call 1-800-332-1201, or email techsupport@itstriangle.net. Additional spare backup batteries to be stored in your home may be purchased from our company. Our 8-hour backup batteries cost approximately \$30 each and can be purchased at our warehouse location in Havre, Montana or one can be shipped directly to your home, for an additional charge.

- **Third Party provided spare backup batteries:** You can also purchase additional spare backup batteries to keep on hand in your home through many of your local retailers such as Best Buy or on-line. Please contact our company and we will gladly provide you with the information you need to ensure that you purchase a quality battery model that meets the requirements for powering your network terminal.

Expected Backup Power Duration: Backup batteries are expected to provide at least 8 hours of standby power. The backup battery should give you at least 2 hours of talk time. If you feel that is not enough time, you may extend your standby power by purchasing from our company or a third-party additional spare 8-hour batteries.

A 24-hour battery back-up unit is also available for an additional charge. This unit will provide 24 hours of standby power and at least 5 hours of talk time.

If you feel that this is a better option for you, this unit can be purchased from our company for approximately \$240.00.

Instructions for Proper Care and Use of Your Battery: Please follow the more detailed instructions included with your battery for proper use, storage, and care of your battery to ensure that it will function as needed during a power outage. If you do not store your battery correctly, it may shorten its useful life. Environmental factors such as temperature can shorten your battery's useful life. We recommend that you store your battery above 41°F and below 104°F. These batteries are rechargeable. They will not last forever and should be replaced every 2 to 3 years, or when your device starts to make a loud beeping sound. That sound means that the battery is depleted and must be replaced. You should also periodically, as described in the instructions included with your battery, remove and test your battery to verify both the operation of the backup battery and its condition.
