


COMMUNITY PROFILE: MELVILLE


Located between Harlowton and Big Timber on Hwy 191, Melville is nestled in the Crazy Mountains with beautiful views from any direction that you look.

The Café 191 log building has long been a landmark when traveling the highway. Throughout the early months of the Covid pandemic, the building was remodeled by the Cremer family and has been the home of Café 191 since June 2020. Bonita, along with her husband, Matt, and their son, Justin own and operate Sweet Grass Land and Cattle supplying their own local ranch raised beef to Café 191.

Café 191 is known for incredible home cooked meals. Bonita has taken her years of experience cooking for the ranch and is now sharing it with locals and travelers. Their menu contains

wholesome ingredients, many of them sourced from fellow Montana producers whenever possible. The café is also available to rent for private parties and offers catering services.

As with many small businesses, Café 191 has felt the pinch of staffing shortages and food supply chain delays. With these ongoing challenges in mind, Bonita has opted to be more creative with the menu and hours of operation. Café 191 will be open weekends for dinner hours only, still offering the very popular Pizza Buffet Nights. Additionally, plans are underway to host an outdoor concert event in the field behind the cafe building this August. The Montana Legislature established the Connect MT program last year with federal stimulus funds. The intent of this program is to improve broadband internet across Montana. For Triangle we are continuing our plan of delivering fiber to the rest of our cooperative territory. Triangle does not plan on using any of the Connect MT program dollars to deliver fiber to the rest of our cooperative service area. Your cooperative has been running extremely efficient over the last six years and has developed and implemented plans to use our current cash flow to fund our internal projects, without grant dollars or borrowing funds to do so.

There are several areas outside of the Triangle cooperative area that are looking for a provider to come into their area and provide the excellent service that Triangle provides every day. Triangle Communications Systems Inc., a subsidiary of Triangle Telephone Cooperative Inc., is looking at areas around the state that may make sense for us to serve and possibly use the Connect MT program.

For our Triangle Cooperative projects this year, we are underway in the Moore, South Malta, another section of the town of Big Timber and the Whispering Pines areas. We thank our members in these areas for your patience and understanding during these important upgrades.

For those of you living in the areas mentioned above, during the upgrades you may see paint marks in your yard or fields. These locates are required by Montana State Law, so please understand we are complying with the law and ensuring that service is not interrupted as we proceed with our projects. As always, please remain safe and enjoy our spring; however long that may be.



CALL MT 811 BEFORE YOU DIG... IT'S THE LAW

Whether you are an excavator, farmer, or homeowner, if you are digging or placing any object in the ground, you are required to get marks indicating the location of the underground utilities. The person doing the digging is the person who must call 811 to request the locate.

Here is the information you will need when you call 811:

- Your name, phone number, company name (if applicable) and mailing address.
- An alternate contact person in case the utility companies have questions and cannot reach you.
- What type of work is being done.
- Who the work is being done for.
- The county and city the work is taking place in.
- The address or the street where the work is taking place.
- The nearest cross street or road.
- The distance and direction to the worksite from that intersection. (Directions are required if no address is provided.)
- Specific instructions to where the work is taking place.
- Please use white or pink paint or white or pink flags to outline the area you are digging in.
- Township, range, section, and quarter section of the worksite and GPS Coordinate of the center point of the digging area.

This information helps the customer service representative determine which utility companies need to be notified of your excavation plans. This process makes sure all the utilities are located and those facility owners who do not have lines are not needlessly notified.

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM (ACP)

We're excited to participate in the FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). This program is designed to make broadband more affordable and accessible for all. Through this program, qualifying members will be eligible for a discount on internet service.

The ACP program helps low-income households pay for broadband service.

If your household is eligible, you can receive:

- Up to a \$30/month discount on your internet service
- Up to a \$75/month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands

Program Requirements

To qualify for this discount program, your household must fulfill one of the below requirements:

- Has an income that is at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines. Participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline
- Participates in Tribal specific programs, such as Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
- Is approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision in the 2019-2020, 2020-2021, or 2021-2022 school year
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year

Only one monthly service discount is allowed per household.

Please have your Qualifying ID Number ready to provide. An additional form will be emailed to you by the customer service representative to be completed before the ACP credit can be added.

*ACP is a government program that reduces the households broadband Internet access service bill. Household will be subject to Triangle's undiscounted rates and general terms and conditions if member no longer qualifies or does not recertify with ACP. Households may obtain broadband service supported by the ACP from any participating provider of their choosing. Households may transfer their ACP benefit to another provider at any time. Household may make changes to their existing service at any time.

MAKING SURE YOUR PAYMENT IS APPLIED CORRECTLY



Each day Triangle receives large numbers of payments. Once the payments are opened and sorted by company, the bill statements accompanied by checks are run through a machine which reads the statement and the check. This process allows us to post payments to our members' accounts quickly.

Here a few other tips to making sure your payment can be processed quickly:

Enclose the payment stub with your payment.

- Please DO NOT staple, tape or paper clip your payment to the payment stub. Staples and tape can cause problems with the machine and those payments must be processed separately.

- If there are special instructions for your payment(s), please make note on the payment stub or write a note on a piece of paper but DO NOT attach to the stub.
- Please use blue or black pen. Other colors can not be read by our payment processor.
- Phone and Internet payments can be paid with one check, but please send the payment stubs or write all the account numbers on the memo line on your check.
- If you are paying an amount different than what is on the stub, please be sure to write the amount you want applied to the account on the stub.

TRIANGLE COMMUNICATIONS USE OF CUSTOMER PROPRIETARY NETWORK INFORMATION

Triangle Telephone Cooperative Association, doing business as Triangle Communications respects your privacy and observes the privacy rules established by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the Montana Public Service Commission. Under federal law, you have the right to confidentiality of information regarding the telecommunications services to which you subscribe and Triangle Communications (Triangle) has the duty to protect that confidentiality. This confidential information includes such things as specific telecommunications services you purchase, the number of services purchased, who your provider is for a service, call detail records and charges related to services purchased. This information is referred to as Customer Proprietary Network Information (CPNI).

Triangle does not sell your account information or provide details of your telephone calls to other parties, unless required by law enforcement. Triangle is authorized by the FCC to market, without approval, services to our customers within the categories of telecommunications service to which those customers subscribe. Specifically, those services are local and long distance service. Triangle provides long distance through its subsidiary, Triangle Communication System, Incorporated. From time to time we may market additional features to customers who subscribe to one or more of the service categories and do so through our subsidiary's.

Federal regulations require that telecommunications customers be given the opportunity to decline if the provider plans to use CPNI to market communications-related services outside of those to which customers subscribe. Communications-related services include Internet in addition to local, long distance and wireless. Declining to receive these offers will not affect any of your current services. If you decide to opt-out of having your CPNI accessed or used for marketing communications-related services outside of those to which you subscribe, please let us know within 30 days by e-mail:

Send an e-mail message to CPNI@itsTriangle.net; we will need your name, telephone number(s), and the effective opt-out date. This information will be kept on file and your CPNI will not be used for marketing any communications-related services outside of those to which you subscribe unless you expressly revoke your opt-out notification by the method listed above. Please be aware that if we don't hear from you after 30 days has passed, we will presume that you have not opted-out but know that you can notify us at any time if you change your mind.
