



RECIPE

Grilled Lime-Cilantro Chuck Steak

From HCE/Triangle Cooking for a Cure Cookbook

INGREDIENTS

- 3 Tbsp. fresh lime juice
- 3 Tbsp. water
- 1 small jalapeno pepper, seeded and chopped.
- 1 Tbsp. chopped cilantro
- 1 lg. garlic clove, minced
- 1/4 tsp. ground cumin
- 1 1/4 lb. boneless beef chuck eye steaks. about 1" thick

DIRECTIONS

In a glass baking dish large enough to hold the steaks, combine all ingredients except steaks. Add steaks and turn a few times to coat well. Cover and marinade in the refrigerator, turning occasionally if you can. Remove steaks at least an hour later and grill to your liking. Discard marinade.

RECIPE

Green Bean Bake

From HCE/Triangle Cooking for a Cure Cookbook

INGREDIENTS

- 1 1/2 Tbsp. butter
- 3 Tbsp. flour
- 1 ½ cups milk
- 3 tsp. dry ranch dressing mix
- ½ tsp. pepper
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2 cloves garlic, minced

- 1 ½ cups fresh mushrooms. sliced
- 1 1/4 pounds fresh green beans, cooked
- 1 cup fresh breadcrumbs, toasted

DIRECTIONS

Melt butter in a small saucepan. Stir in flour and cook for 1 to 2 minutes, stirring constantly. Using a whisk, stir in milk and bring to a boil. Cook 1 to 2 minutes or until thickened, whisking constantly. Remove from heat. Stir in dressing mix and pepper. Set aside. Cook garlic and onion in a skillet sprayed with cooking spray until tender. Remove half of onion mixture and cook until mushrooms are tender. Combine green beans and white sauce, pour into a large casserole dish. Combine breadcrumbs with reserved onion mixture and sprinkle over casserole. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes.

RECIPE

Cream Cheese Squares

From HCE/Triangle Cooking for a Cure Cookbook

INGREDIENTS

- 2 (8 oz.) cans refrigerated crescent roll dough
- 2 (8 oz.) pkgs cream cheese
- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

- ½ cup margarine, melted
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease a 9x13 inch pan. Press one can of the crescent rolls into the bottom of the prepared pan. In a medium bowl, mix together cream cheese, 1 cup of sugar and vanilla until smooth and creamy. Spread over the crescent layer. Unroll the second can of crescent rolls and lay them over the top of the cream cheese layer. Do not press down. Pour the melted margarine over the entire pan. Combing the remaining ¼ cup of sugar and cinnamon; sprinkle over the top. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until the top is crisp and golden.


This year we have two Districts up for election: District 1 and District 3. Watch your mail for the Annual Meeting Notice, as well as the mailin ballot which will be sent out to members.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING YOUR ALLOCATED CAPITAL CREDITS

Triangle is a cooperative. For cooperatives, the members are also the owners. Your ownership in the Cooperative is represented by capital credits. Members receive capital credit allocations based on usage (also known as patronage) of Triangle's services each year.

The board is doing a general retirement for the year 2002 and has decided to also offer an allocated capital credit discounted offer as well. The Cooperative will pay each present and former member who have an allocated account during the discounted time period, the present worth or discounted present value (discounted amount) of the member's allocated capital credits for the years 2003 to 2022.

Information regarding the discounted capital credit balance was included in the letter mailed out in July to all members, past and present, with an allocated capital credit account. If you elect to participate in the discounted offer, please sign the form included with the letter and return in the envelope provided with the letter, you can deliver it to the Havre or Big Timber office, fax it to 406-394-7815 or scan and email to capitalcredits@itstriangle.net. Acceptance forms must be RECEIVED before September 15, 2023. NO EXCEPTIONS will be made for acceptance forms RECEIVED AFTER SEPTEMBER 15, 2023.

If you choose not to participate in the discounted offer, you will **NOT** receive a retirement of your allocated capital credits for the specified years between 2003 and 2022. No further action will be required on your part and your allocated capital credit balance for the years 2003 to 2022 will remain unchanged. Members will still be eligible to receive future retirements of all allocated capital credits when approved by the board.

If you are participating in the discounted offer, you will receive the 2022 general retirement amount included with the discount check. If you are not participating in the discounted offer, a check for the 2002 general retirement will be sent to you.


