

RECIPE

Lemon Poppy Seed Cake

Makes 1 cake

INGREDIENTS

- 1 pkg. lemon cake mix
- 1 sm. pkg. instant lemon pudding ½ cup oil
- 1 cup water
- 4 eggs
- 1/4 cup poppy seeds

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°.
- 2. With a mixer, beat all ingredients together until well blended.
- 3. Grease a bundt pan and pour in cake mixture.
- 4. Bake for 45 minutes.
- 5. Dust with powdered sugar before serving

RECIPE

Hamburger Soup from HCE/Triangle Relay for Life Team Cookbook

INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb. hamburger
- 1 cup chopped onion
- ½ cup chopped celery
- 1 Tbsp. butter

NAVIGATING THE FUTURE OF RURAL BROADBAND:

COOPERATIVES, USF REFORM, AND A LANDMARK COURT CASE

Rural broadband cooperatives like Triangle Communications provide vital communication services to the communities that we serve. We are facing a critical juncture this year with a renewed focused on Universal Service Fund (USF) reform.

USF has historically played a

crucial role in supporting infrastructure development in rural areas, making it possible for us to reach the communities you live in. The current system is facing increased scrutiny and currently being challenged at the Supreme Court.

The challenge originated in the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals, where the court questioned the fundamental legal authority of certain FCC decisions regarding USF. The case guickly escalated to the Supreme Court, where it now sits awaiting a decision. The Supreme Court's ruling will hold far-reaching implications for the USF and the country.

The legal battle has sparked intense debate and engagement from industry organizations. NTCA, the Rural Broadband Association, has been vocal in its assessment of the case. NTCA has expressed concern about preserving the essential purpose of the USF: ensuring that all Americans, regardless of location, have access to essential communications services. They have also focused on the uncertainty created by the court challenge, emphasizing the potential disruption

to broadband expansion plans if fundamental funding mechanisms are altered.

Similarly, WTA – Advocates for Rural Broadband, has also commented on the potential far-reaching consequences of this legal action. Aligning closely with NTCA, WTA has underscored the constitutionality, and importance of a predictable robust USF for deploying broadband in the most challenging rural areas. They highlight the crucial role the fund plays in bridging the digital divide and enabling economic opportunity in rural communities.

Next Steps:

- Stay informed: Follow reliable news sources and industry publications concerning the Supreme Court decision and USF reform.
- Be ready to engage with your cooperative: Watch our Facebook page and website to find out when we need you to speak up for USF.
- When needed we will contact our representatives: We will share when and who you need to contact when and if we need your support to fight for USF.

As the CEO of Triangle, I am actively monitoring the court case and the progress of USF reform efforts. I am also on the regulatory committees for both NTCA and WTA and will continue to be involved to keep your best interests at heart and in the forefront of my mind and actions.

Triangle Communications Backup Battery Customer Notice 2025

Traditional Residential Voice: For many years, your home telephone would allow you to stay connected to emergency voice services during a power outage. However, if your residential voice telephone service is provided using fiber optics or fixed wireless rather than the traditional copper-based line, then your residential voice telephone service requires backup battery power to continue functioning during an outage. To avoid a disruption of home voice service during an outage and to maintain the ability to connect to 911 emergency services during an outage, Triangle Communications provides you with a battery for the backup power for your residential voice telephone service at the time of the initial installation at no additional cost.

Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP Service): Voice service that is delivered over the Triangle Communications network to the home via an Internet connection is a VoIP service. VoIP service subscribers have the option to purchase an Uninterruptable Power Supply (UPS) battery backup from Triangle Communications or provide their own. The UPS battery backup obtained through Triangle will provide power for approximately 2 hours of

talk time with 8 hours of standby time for VoIP service during a power outage. However, without this battery backup this service (including dialing 911) will not function during a power outage. Subscribers may purchase a longer-lasting UPS from Triangle. if desired. Subscribers will own the battery backup and are responsible for the maintenance and replacement of the unit.

What Your Battery Can and Can't Do for You: The backup battery provided by Triangle Communications is not a substitute for commercial/ primary power at a location. The backup battery is for powering the fiber optic or fixed wireless network terminal providing traditional residential voice service during a power outage. Without a backup battery or alternate backup source such as a generator, customers with fiber or fixed wireless based residential telephone service will not be able to make any calls, including emergency calls to 911. The only way to maintain the ability to use your telephone is by using some form of backup power. Our backup battery does not provide power to any services other than voice. All Internet services are turned off in the network terminal after 5 minutes of power outage to better conserve battery power for traditional voice service. Home security systems, cordless phones, medical monitoring devices, and other equipment will not run on a residential voice telephone backup battery.

Replacement Options: As previously noted, a backup battery has been provided by Triangle Communications during the initial installation of traditional residential voice services. However, the battery provided by our company may need to be replaced every two or three years or when the battery is no longer functioning.

- · Triangle Communications provided replacement backup batteries — Triangle Communications will provide and install at no cost to you, a replacement backup battery, upon appointment, when it becomes known that the battery needs to be replaced. If you have any questions, please call 1-800-332-1201, or email techsupport@ itstriangle.net. Additional backup batteries to be stored in your home may be purchased from our company. Our 8-hour backup batteries cost approximately \$30 each and can be purchased at our warehouse location in Havre. Montana or one can be shipped directly to your home, for an additional charge.
- Third Party provided spare backup batteries —You can also purchase additional spare backup batteries to keep on hand in your home through many local retailers such as Best Buy or online. Please contact our company and we will gladly provide you with the information you need to ensure that you purchase a quality battery model that meets the requirements for powering your network terminal.

Expected Backup Power Duration:

Backup batteries are expected to provide at least 8 hours of standby power. The backup battery should give you at least 2 hours of talk time. If you feel that is not enough time, you may extend your standby power by purchasing from our company or a third-party additional spare 8-hour batteries.

A 24-hour battery back-up unit is also available for an additional charge. This unit provides 24 hours of standby power and at least 5 hours of talk time. If you feel this is a better option for you, you can purchase this unit from us for approximately \$240.

Instructions for Proper Care and Use: Please follow the more detailed instructions included with your battery for proper use, storage, and care of your battery to ensure that it will function as needed during a power outage. If you do not store your battery correctly, it may shorten its useful life. Environmental factors such as temperature can shorten your battery's useful life. We recommend that you store your battery above 41°F and below 104°F. These batteries are rechargeable. They will not last forever and should be replaced every 2 to 3 years, or when your device starts to make a loud beeping sound. That sound means that the battery is depleted and must be replaced. You should also periodically, as described in the instructions included with your battery, remove and test your battery to verify both the operation of the backup battery and its condition.

ALWAYS CALL 811 BEFORE DIGGING

DO I HAVE TO GET UNDERGROUND FACILITIES LOCATED? YES! Whether you are a professional excavator, a farmer, or a homeowner – If you are digging or placing any object in the ground, you are required to get marks indicating the location of underground utilities. The person doing the excavating is the person that has to make the call.

Montana Law, Annotated Code, 69-4-502 states: "...an excavator may not make or begin an excavation without first obtaining information concerning the possible location of an underground facility from each public utility, municipal corporation, underground facility owner, or other person having the right to bury underground facilities that is a member of a one-call notification center"

Montana Law, Annotated Code, 69-4-503 states: "Before beginning an excavation, the excavator shall notify, through a one-call notification center, all owners of underground facilities in the area of the proposed excavation."

THERE ARE ALREADY MARKS THERE FROM AN EARLIER LOCATE, CAN I USE

THEM? NO! You may not use someone else's locate marks. You don't know how old they are and if they are still valid or not. Things can change over time or it may not cover the same area that you are digging in.

CAN I USE A COMPUTER TO REQUEST A LOCATE? YES, YOU CAN. Visit call811.com, hover over "Start Here" on the menu at the top

of the screen, then select either Homeowner or Excavator. In the drop-down, choose Submit A Locate Request.

WHAT IS 811? 811 is the national number designated by the Federal Communications Commission to help protect do-it-yourselfers, landscapers and contractors from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on digging projects – large and small.

WHY CALL 811? Every digging project requires a call to 811. Hitting an underground utility line while digging can cause damage to the environment, serious personal injuries, disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and potentially incur fines and repair costs.

WHEN TO CALL 811?

- Installing a rural mailbox
- Putting in a fence
- Planting trees or shrubbery
- Building a patio or deck
- Excavating a new garden area

* These are a few common examples of when to call. You or your contractor should call at least 2 business day before any digging project.

HOW DOES 811 WORK? One easy phone call

to 811, at least 2 business days prior to digging, starts the process of getting your underground utility lines marked for free.

When you call 811 from anywhere in the country, a representative from your local one call center will answer your call. Local one call center



representative will ask you for the location and description of your digging job, and will notify affected utility companies, who will then send a professional locator to the proposed dig site to mark the approximate location of your lines within a few days of your call.

Once your underground lines have been marked, you will know the approximate location of your utility lines and can dig safely.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T CALL? There

is one unintentional hit every three minutes, which can lead to injury, repair costs, fines and expensive and inconvenient outages.

37% of these incidents are caused due to a failure to call 811 before digging. Another 37% are due to not digging safely around the marks.

Knowing approximately where underground utility lines are buried before each digging project helps to prevent these situations.
